Proclamation

Whereas:

The Veterans of Allen County embraced through sacrifice and service to our country, the most fundamental and cherished bonds in our democracy; and

WHEREAS : The Veterans of Allen County reaffirm that commitment to democratic ideals by accepting it as the solemn responsibility of our survival to bear the burden of what has been, so that tragedy once endured can never be forgotten; and

WHEREAS : Among the Veterans of Allen County, it is important to make a special mention of all the Women who have served, in some capacity from the Revolutionary War thru service Operations ongoing today. Although not always recognized, over 700,000 women have served our nation since 1898.

WHEREAS : Citizens, veterans, and patriots should recognize that the true measure of personal worth is to be found in the willingness to draw from the strength and convictions born of heritage and experience; and

WHEREAS : It is proper to honor, with dignity, the sacred memory of the war dead, those still unaccounted for, and those who are disabled and to insure that the lasting legacy of the fallen, the unaccounted for and the disabled veterans are forever remembered.

NOW THEREFORE : I, David J. Berger, Mayor of the City of Lima, Ohio, do hereby proclaim Monday, May 30, 2016 as

in Lima, Ohio, and urge all citizens of Lima to observe this day by paying tribute to those who have given the supreme sacrifice of their lives in service to our nation, and to continue to encourage peace and harmony between peoples and nations of the world.
